

Contents of this kit

1. Astronaut star projector

Transform your space into a galactic light show.

Sensory liquid mat

Feel the cosmos in your hands or under your feet!

3. Scented candle

Spark celestial calm with fragrances that waft you through the stars.

4. Hourglass

Traverse time with each grain of sand.

5. Stacking stones

Balance these fragments from different planets to create an interstellar monument.

6. Table topic cards

Cards that prompt discussion, evoke emotional and sensory responses, and connect us deeper.

7. Squishy ball Squeeze and relax.

8. Scales with astronauts

Discover cosmic balance through a playful, hands-on exploration of weight, math, and equilibrium.

9. Squishy caterpillar

This malleable creature invites tactile exploration of alien biology.

10. Squidpop

Alien communication device or cosmic musical instrument? The squidpop's purpose is yours to discover.

11. Activity cube

Navigate through asteroid fields or decode alien languages with this multifaceted cosmic tool.

12. Slime


Mold galaxies, create alien life forms, or simulate cosmic goo with interstellar slime.

Notes and ideas

To all the wonderful parents out there, remember that the journey through space is also a journey through inner space. Use this kit to teach your kids about finding calm in the chaos, just like in the vast, tranquil cosmos.



Family Evenings Under the Stars

Turn off the lights, switch on the projector, and while lying on the floor or bed, discuss constellations, planets, and the possibility of life in space. This promotes relaxation and strengthens the bond between parents and children.

"A towel is about the most massively useful thing an interstellar hitchhiker can have."

Every space traveler knows that before setting off on an adventure, grab a Don't Panic Towel. Its uses are limited only by your imagination. The guide suggests using it for warmth, as a bed, as a sail for a mini-raft, or even as head protection. Engage kids in a fun game where they brainstorm unique ways to use the towel in space.



Infinite Improbability Drive

Discuss the concept of the Infinite Improbability Drive. Then, challenge each other to come up with the most improbable scenarios involving the items in the kit. The more imaginative and unlikely, the better! Try to brainstorm 42 different ways items can be used, combined, or played with.

Space Meditation

Light the scented candle. As the room fills with the calming scent and the stars twinkle above, use the sensory toys to engage your tactile senses. This multi-sensory experience can help deepen relaxation and meditation (you don't even need to use worm larvae secretions from a desert planet). Encourage everyone to gaze at the candle's flame, observing its movements and colors. Note how it dances, flickers, brightens, and dims. Instruct everyone to take a deep breath in, slowly, for a count of 4. Hold the breath for a count of 4, then exhale slowly through the mouth for a count of 6. The extended exhale helps promote relaxation. Practice exhaling slowly toward the candle so that you can control the flame without extinguishing it.

Exploring Cosmic Textures

Close your eyes, picture the darkness of space, and try to guess textures by touch. Depriving one sense increases the others. Embark on a sensory journey beyond your fingertips. Why limit exploration to your hands? Challenge yourself and your little astronauts to identify textures with your cheeks, the tips of your ears, or the soles of your feet.

Cosmic Sensory Bin

Transform the kit's box into a universe of tactile exploration! Fill it with tactile treasures, whether from the kit or your own collection, immersing young astronauts in a sensory-rich galaxy. After blindfolding them, let their fingers wander through diverse textures, uncover hidden cosmic wonders, and craft their own celestial narratives. For an authentic space vibe, consider using rice or similar materials as a 'cosmic' base, enhancing the exploratory experience.

Space Science

Pretend the slime is an alien sample that needs to be analyzed in a space lab. Use the different textures of the squidpop, squishy caterpillar, and activity cube to experiment with the slime. Document your findings like a true xenobiologist!

Intergalactic Diplomacy

Using the table topic cards, discuss potential scenarios where you'd have to negotiate with aliens for peace, just like humans who wear black suits and work for the government. What gifts (from the kit or your household) would you offer as a peace token? If negotiations are going poorly, use the activity cube as a memory eraser (like the black suits do) and start over.

Build Cosmic Pyramids

Compete to see who can build higher pyramids, maintaining balance and concentration. As you build structures with the stones, discuss what types of monuments aliens might build and why. Create stories about the civilizations that built them-they don't need to be landing pads for spaceships!



Use your scales with astronauts to learn about balance. Try balancing different items from your kit. What's heavier, a handful of 'stardust' or a 'meteorite'? Document your findings; you're a real astrophysicist now!

Starry Night Music Session

Play calming space-themed music. Each family member gets a turn to interpret the music using any of the sensory toys and explaining their choice. For instance, they might roll the squishy ball to the rhythm or create patterns with the squidpop.

Ever felt the weight of the universe on your shoulders? Sometimes, all you need is a cosmic twirl to the rhythm of the stars. The next time stress tries to suck you into a black hole, just dance it out. It's like magic, but real!



Zero-Gravity Dance-Off

Pretend you're astronauts in zero gravity
and have a slow-motion dance-off! Move
slowly and gracefully,
as if you're in space,
and use the sensory
toys as props. Jump
like you're on the
moon. What about
Michael Jackson's
moonwalk? For added
fun, do this under the
star projector light.

Astronomical Art Studio

Use the slime and squishy toys to create alien artwork or cosmic scenes, discussing the possible landscapes, colors, and physical laws of far-off worlds. How might art differ across the universe, and why?
