# Notes and ideas 

Let's talk about sweet things, so you know where to begin. But if you're someone who can proudly declare, "Sometimes I give myself the crêpes!" don't hesitate just follow your fancy!

## Picking a task

Where do you buy sweets?
And by "sweets" we mean everything sweet - from candy bars to cakes. It's time to launch another mission to visit your favorite place. Prepare to spice things up while you're there by completing a couple of tasks. Here, take a look.

- Search for sweet stuff that's blue! The person who brings back the most blue goodies wins! Only the blue ones - not violet, not purple, just blue. Light blue ones count too.
- We're doing some research that's aimed at finding the traditional treats of all the countries on Earth. Do you know of any Peruvian candies? And what are desserts like in Iceland? How about Italy? You get the idea. Go find and buy them!
- This is a tricky one: a time traveler told us that there are still candies sold in our stores today that used to be there more than a hundred years ago. Can you find out which ones?


## The mission begins

 So, when the task has been chosen, go on a journey and gather as much sweet stuff as you can (while complying with the task conditions). Even if you do this online, the mission is important! And if you want to step up your game a bit, try buying ingredients instead of readymade sweets.Choose a task you like, or come up with your own tasks for the mission! There's no special approval process for new tasks - just invent one and go. (This is mainly because our Task Approval Team is on vacation until August 2356, so we don't want to disturb them to check if your task is good enough. Of course it is!)

Kids don't always like shopping, but they always like a good game. So let's turn shopping into a game: who can find the most types of red sweets, who's the first to find the biggest marshmallow, who knows what cornstarch is and where in the store it's hidden?

## Blind tests

Now we need to study the samples we gathered during the mission. Put them on plates and have one researcher put on the eye mask. Then ask the researcher to smell the samples and try to guess what each one is. Then they try to guess it by touch. Can you guess the color by taste? Can you guess the shape by smell? It doesn't matter if you're wrong or right you still get to eat it!

When the mission is completed, proceed to the exit and travel homeward to set up the tasting facility.

## Fewer senses, more fun!

Let's make it even more complex. Close your eyes, close your nose with the nose clamp, and bite into the next thing on the plate. Is it sweet? Can you even tell what it is? Did you know that it's hard to tell tea from coffee if you can't smell it?

## Make it colorfood!

 Do some sweets seem mundane to you? That's not a big deal when you have food colors. You can even decorate fruit so that it looks like cake. The rule is simple: decorated food is always good. It's like adding hot butter to popcorn - it always works!
## Fancy a second helping?

The best part is that these activities have no end, although you can stop whenever you want. But the best way of doing them is by setting up a family ritual, or as we call it, "a sweet moment." Think of a secret handshake that starts and ends the sweet moment; maybe you can even come up with a short poem for the beginning and the end? Or dance to "Tutti Frutti", perhaps?



Rituals enhance our sense of taste. This is because during the ritual, we're more focused on the moment, and we really pay attention to what we eat and drink. So setting up rituals can turn simple joys like food into a real celebration.

See, that's why we need more celebrations!
Oh, honey pie, you are making me crazy!

Putting a recipe here would take up too much space, but have you ever heard of a thing called the internet? We're sure you'll be able to find a recipe there, and we've already provided some balloons ... see where this is going?

## Ice is cool!

lce doesn't have to be made out of water, Try freezing milk, juice, or lemonade! Think of how you can use those ice cubes.

Alphabet of taste As many great scientific researchers have pointed out - words are made out of letters. And the ingredients of desserts are words, so they also have letters in them. Let's combine these pieces of knowledge into
an ultra-knowledge that helps us build sweet confections! For example, the word "play" is really tasty because it consists of Pineapple, Licorice, Apple, and Yogurt. So now you have a whole language of recipes!
