 Green sticker — item can be used by children and adults


Red sticker — item should be used by adults only

Notes and ideas

Gloves on hands, tools lined up, inspiration at the ready — this is going to be the most popular bug hotel in the neighborhood!

Hey, you! Yes, you! Have they told you that you need to build a resort? Don't listen to them! They're conformists!
Build an old gnome village by a waterfall. Or — wait, wait! Build a windmill on a desert island!
Or a school for forest critters!
Just build something already!

To plan or not to plan?

Start by drawing the building — or landscape — for bugs that you want to create in your yard. This isn't an essential step, but it will help you avoid running into a lot of challenges later on during the actual construction. Having a hard time coming up with ideas? Remember the hotels and resorts you've stayed in during your vacations!

Let the building begin!

We'll start by building the bug hotel from the kit, and then you can add other places around it if you wish. That way, you can create a whole resort with different facilities and cool relaxation zones!

A lot of people dislike insects, but they're very important to every ecosystem!



Also, birds eat them. So they must taste good! I wish I could be a bird, so it would be 0K for me to eat bugs.





Some very small animals will use your bug hotel as a safe place to lay eggs, breed offspring, or hide from predators. Be ready to welcome lots of different guests right before winter starts.

Made by nature

You can gather materials outside to use in your bug resort. The best hotels for insects are built with natural materials like leaves, branches, sticks, and stones — all of which you can get for free!

Bugs can be picky

Different insects like different materials and different kinds of nests for breeding and winter hibernation. Some like wood, others prefer leaves, and another type hides under stones. Lighting and temperature also matter. So if you manage to position your resort in such a way that part of it is lit by the sun and the other part is in shade, you'll attract more quests.

Insects have preferences for where they nest or hibernate. Wood is an ideal habitat for carpenter beetles, and if its bark isn't damaged, it can do double duty for centipedes and wood lice that like to live under the bark. Other insects that like to hide under loose bark include beetles and spiders. Straw, hay, and dry leaves are also good.



But why are we only talking about insects? What about garden gnomes? Or stones with eyes? Or those yellow dudes who can't talk properly? Anyways, let's decorate

Insects indoors

So, imagine you're a bug. Yeah, one of those things with six legs, a weird jaw, and cool, compound eyes. You've been on a long Air Dragonfly flight, in the middle seat between two dung beetles who kept arguing about cow pies. And then the flight attendant forgot you'd ordered a vegan lunch. And to top it all off, your luggage took ages to arrive at the belt. The roach taxi was 0K, but the traffic was awful and you got motion sickness. At last, you've made it to the hotel. You need some rest. What would your ideal room look like — one where you can relax and chill? Find inspiration in the hotels you've visited before. Name your hotel, make a sign, and keep the exhausted Mr. Bug in mind.

Use all the available art supplies, and get inspired by your favorite architect! Don't have one? Then it's time to find out who it is!



Bee hospitable

Your hotel is advertised as "a home from home." So what do insects need at home? Probably the same things as you do. Where can they park their Volkswagen Beetles? Do ants like to hang out in hammocks? How many shoe horns does a centipede need? And when you're done decorating, set up signs for every building in your resort!

Follow the genius

Leonardo da Vinci invented a lot of stuff, including a helicopter, an ideal city, and a bridge! You can actually build this bridge for your little guests, and connect two parts of the resort together. As the genius inventor, painter, and scientist once said, "Give a bug a bridge, and it won't realize that it has a bridge!"



Do bugs need transportation? How about your next project being a bug metro? You can dig long ditches, put paper straws in them, and create a series of tunnels. Or the tunnels can be above ground instead of underground! Or both at the same time! Oh my! My head is exploding with ideas!

We all know that bugs don't know what electricity is, but you know what it is. This means you can add lighting to your resort so it looks awesome in the evening! And adding a Zen garden and a fountain immediately puts your resort in all the best travel guides in the bug world.



Dinner party

If you offer insects the food they like, chances are they will come to stay and stick around for a while. So think about planting some colorful, fragrant flowers in or around your resort to attract butterflies and bees.

Do beetles love the **Beat**les?

Animals, birds, and insects don't like loud noises, but your resort can still feature some wind chime melodies. First of all, that sweet sound never gets old, and second of all, this is mostly for you — the bugs won't notice it anyway.

So fresh and so clean-clean

Don't forget to take good care of your resort, and clean it regularly. Change the water in the pools, remove fallen leaves, and fix the worn parts. Or just build new stuff when it's needed!
